MWBE Contracts Increase in New York State



There were 1.9 billion in contracts awarded to MWBE-Certified firms in the fiscal year that ended March 31st, 2016 out of 7.5 billion in total spending by state agencies and authorities.

In 2015, \$1.69 billion of the 7.2 billion in state agency and authority spending was awarded to MWBE Certified firms.

Governor Coumo has put a big emphasis on MWBEs since taking office, with the intent of broadening opportunities for businesses that were shut out of state contracts due to discriminatory practices. The utilization plan that Governor Cuomo has set includes a statewide goal to achieve 30% utilization -- the highest in the nation. (Utilization rate is the ratio between total amount of spending by state agencies/authorities that must comply with the MWBE

requirements vs. the amount of contract dollars actually awarded to MWBE firms during the fiscal year).

"We need all the firms to work with the state to help us achieve the 30% goal." said Alphonso David, counsel to the governor. Alphonso David has overseen the program for the administration for the past six years. "That means firms should think about entering into joint ventures to increase capacity; majority firms should think about ways to create consortiums to support MWBEs; and firms should feel comfortable telling state agencies to indentify problems they see in the system."
