# **eRx-STEP 1 - Choosing Authentication Method**



Credentialed providers will automatically be set up to e-Prescribe UNCONTROLLED substances, however there are 2 steps that are needed to set up your Meditech E-Prescribe Controlled Substances (EPCS) access with Dr. First.

STEP 1. Download the Symantec VIP Access app to your smart phone or request a key fob.

### New York State e-prescribing Controlled Substances (EPCS) Summary

When prescribing a Schedule II thru V controlled substance, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) requires providers to sign and electronically send the prescription using two-factor authentication. Two-factor authentication is a combination of "something you know" such as a password and "something you have"; like a token that generates a temporary security code.


ECMC has contracted with OPFirst for this process.

#### **Choose an Authentication Method**

Choose if you would rather use a smart phone app or a physical key fob for the process

- A smart phone app —generates a security code needed for e-prescribing controlled substances.
- **A Key fob** –is a physical token (*approximately 1 ½ inches*) that you will carry with you. It will generate a security code that you will need when prescribing controlled substances.
