A2A, F2F offers Peer & Family support to people with Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and their families/friends/significant others. The A2A, F2F team is made up of Peers who are in recovery themselves and have family members or a loved one with SUD. The Peers share their own lived experience with recovery with those seeking help from SUD.

- A2A Peers are non-judgmental, have suffered their own SUD, understand the shame and guilt associated with using, and have found recovery.
- F2F Peers have been through what many family members are going through. They have enabled their loved ones, spent sleepless nights, walked floors, bailed loved ones out of jail, shown up to court appearances, driven their loved ones to detoxes and rehabs, and understand the shame and guilt you've gone through. F2F Peers have found their own recovery, in order to safely love and support their family member with SUD.

Bringing Recovery and the Message of Hope to the Community and at ECMC

In our community the Peers work with a person with SUD and help them navigate the many avenues to help and recovery. They provide advocacy, referral to services, peer counselling, recovery coaching, linkages to treatment providers, outreach and follow up. The Peers area guide towards the first steps of recovery.

In the ED at ECMC, the Peers carry the message of recovery and hope. Peers meet with people who present to the ED seeking detox from SUD. They are part of the chemical dependency team that screen people for inpatient detox. A2A Peers discuss the many avenues to recovery, explain the benefits of self-help, share their stories and give a listening ear to both the person with SUD and their loved ones who have accompanied them to the ED.

About BRAVE:

Violence is a public health problem that affects us all. At ECMC, we are committed to serving a vital role in efforts to reduce community violence in Buffalo. BRAVE is the region's only hospital-based violence intervention program (HVIP). Through BRAVE, ECMC focuses on the structural causes of violence and provides survivors the tools and connections to make lifestyle changes that prevent re-victimization or further perpetration of violence. Together, BRAVE workers will connect patients and families to culturally sensitive, comprehensive, and multifaceted interventions at ECMC and in the community.

BRAVE Services:

BRAVE advocates provide a full range of services for our program participants. These services include, but are not limited to:

- o Crisis Intervention and Support
- Bedside Hospital Responder from SNUG
- Safety Planning after assessing the situation, provide guidance on orders of protection, law enforcement support, legal services and shelter
- Individual Counseling Sessions by trauma informed mental health professionals
- Mental Health Counseling for the caregivers of survivors of violence
- Trauma Support Groups for survivors of violence
- Intensive Case Management Services
- Applying for Victim Assistance Funds
- Danger/Lethality Assessments to evaluate risk for further harm in a domestic violence situation

- Depression
- Feeling powerless
- Loss of control
- Anger
- Nightmares or flashbacks
- Headaches or upset stomach
- Conflict or withdrawing from friends and family

Your Rights and Responsibilities

What individuals in Addiction Treatment programs need to know

Individuals in an addictions treatment program that is NYS OASAS certified or funded, have certain legal rights and responsibilities.

If you have questions concerning the treatment services you receive, or feel your rights have been violated, follow these steps:

- Talk with your counselor most problems can and should be resolved with your counselor.
- If your counselor cannot resolve the situation, talk with his or her supervisor.
- If you still need help, talk with the director of your program.
- If the matter is still not resolved, call the OASAS
 Patient Advocacy line, 1-800-553-5790, during
 normal business hours. Calls must be made
 from within New York.
